

Tips for Ensuring Eligibility to Vote in West Meadow Metropolitan District Elections

Who is eligible to vote in a District election?

A person who is registered to vote in Colorado, **and**

- a resident of the district, **or**
- property owner (or a spouse/civil union partner of a property owner). Property must be owned in a person's name. An LLC or Trust is not a person.

A residence for purposes of voter registration generally means the principal or primary home or place in which a person lives.

Voter Registration in the State of Colorado

- The Colorado Secretary of State's website, www.GoVoteColorado.gov, provides general information regarding voting in Colorado.
- To verify whether you are registered to vote, visit the following website and enter your name, zip code, and birthday:

- If you are registered to vote, click on "County and District Information" and ensure that West Meadow Metropolitan District is included under "District Information".
- If you are not registered to vote, you may register as follows:
 - Register online if you have a valid Social Security Number, Colorado driver's license, or Colorado ID card.

If you would like to receive a ballot in the mail, you should ensure that you meet eligibility criteria on or before 22 days prior to the election, which will be **April 10, 2023** for the May 2, 2023 election.
